Clarence E. Eddy: Poet Prospector of Idaho & Death Valley (Presented by Gary Eller) – On April 16th at 6:30 PM. Gary Eller present the story and songs of Gary E. Eddy. Orphaned at a young age, Eddy became one of the most colorful and well-known characters to seek riches in the wilds of Central Idaho and the Death Valley region, in the last great American gold rushes from the late 1890's to 1920. Eddy made several major discoveries and was wildly publicized for his adventures in both regions. He wrote five books of poetry & song and hundreds of newspaper articles were published by and about him coast to coast.
